## EXPLOSIONS AND CONTAINMENT OUR WORLDS IN CRISIS

The worlds we inhabit are rocked by explosive crises as people and groups lash out in an attempt to ward off the unraveling of their ideologies. Daily we are both witness and participant in the destruction of the lives of individuals, the demoralization of cultures, and the devastation of our shared natural environment. And yet sometimes we also experience the creation of new worlds of possibility as other containers appear. Whether the new rhetoric is of "weapons of mass destruction," or of "an inconvenient truth," or the tenets of a new Jungian Training Institute, we are drawn into new reflection and experience. We find ourselves in new myths that found new worlds.

Destruction and creation occur both in our lives as analysts and citizens of the world and in our consulting rooms. The crux of the matter lies in whether we survive these analytic explosions and in how our analysts develop as they hold the experiences of inner and outer upheavals. We wait and watch in unfamiliar territory for new vessels and new possibilities. Will we find a passage through the upheavals necessary for the individuation process of individuals and cultures?

This conference will weave together presentations from many different perspectives that address personal and global aspects of crisis, and explore containment and transformation. Topics will range from primal upheavals of body and psyche in symptom and dream, to explosions in war, politics, myth, art and religion. Presentations will take several forms including pre-conference workshops, plenary lectures, concurrent sessions, panels, experiential workshops, and a field trip to the site of Jung's 1936 seminar on Bailey Island, Maine.

We hope that you will join us in these rich explorations in this beautiful place, where we will challenge and nurture our ability to weather the tidal rhythms of our necessary destructions and creations.

The conference is open to all Jungian analysts, candidates in analytic training programs, and other licensed professionals.

## PRE-CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS • THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 18

### AWAKENING CLINICAL SPIRIT: EXPLORING THE WELLSPRINGS OF CHARACTER STRUCTURES [FOR CANDIDATES ONLY] NANCY DOUGHERTY [CSJA/CHICAGO AND IRSJA/INTER-REGIONAL] AND JACQUELINE WEST [NMSJA/NEW MEXICO AND IRSJA/INTER-REGIONAL]

We will consider how knowledge about character structures informs one's ability to hone analytic skill. We will clarify how to make differential diagnoses between character structures in order to decide when to turn towards a psychotherapeutic, ego development intervention or towards an intervention that relies upon a strong and flexible ego that can sustain the analytic tension of an ego-Self dialogue. We will intersperse presentations, which will include slides of art, fairy tale, and myth, with small break-out groups for discussion. This workshop has been organized by the candidates of the C.G. Jung Institute of Boston.

### EMBODIED AFFECTIVE EXPERIENCE: KEY TO TRANSFORMATION ANITA GREENE [NESJA/BOSTON]

Explosions that occur in our consulting rooms are usually the result of the affective archetypal core of a complex being activated. These complexes reside in the body and were often created by the interactions with early caregivers, only to reappear in the psychic and somatic experiencing of analyst and analysand. In this workshop, we will work with the four crisis affects: Fear, Sadness, Anger, and Contempt/Shame. Using clinical examples and experiential exercises, we will explore how to recognize their presence through somatic induction, to tolerate them, and perhaps to discover and acknowledge where we as analysts are also vulnerable to certain emotional states.

### THE STORY OF ONE CANDIDATE ASSOCIATION [FOR CANDIDATES ONLY] ALEX PEER AND SUSAN CALFEE [CANDIDATES, CGJISF/SAN FRANCISCO]

In this workshop, candidates from the San Francisco Candidates Organization will describe the group's turbulent beginnings and how it has developed into an effective voice in representing candidates' needs and interest to the larger community of analysts who make up the Institute. A panel of candidates will discuss the organizations history, current functioning, and future potentials for participating in the life of the Institute. Discussion will be encouraged to initiate sharing and dialogue among CNASJA's many candidates groups.

### EXPLOSION AND CONTAINMENT: WORKING WITH COUPLES IN CONFLICT AND ALIENATION THAYER GREENE [NESJA/BOSTON] AND POLLY YOUNG-EISENDRATH [NYAAP/NEW YORK]

Working with couples is relatively uncharted territory for Jungians, whose interest, literature, and teaching has been focused almost exclusively on the theory and dynamics of one-on-one analytic therapy. In this workshop, we will explore effective methods of facilitating a deepening dialogue and awareness of the role of psyche in the dynamics of conflict and connection between two people. Through the use of clinical examples, discussion, object relations theory, and Jung's essential theoretical insights, we hope to deepen the understanding of how to work with couples whose relationship has become volatile and uncontained.

## CONFERENCE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

To provide clinicians with the current perspectives within Analytical Psychology on a variety of issues, both individual and collective, that bear on clinical practice, contemporary culture, and institutional life.

To provide clinicians with theoretical and clinical material to deepen the understanding of the psyche as it is experienced in analytic practice.

To provide a forum in which clinicians may exchange theoretical ideas and clinical experiences around the issues of individuation of both analyst and analysand in the course of the analytic journey.

## CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT

For the conference, a total of 18 hours, and for each of the pre-conference workshops 3 hours, are offered for licensed clinical social workers, licensed mental health counselors, marriage and family therapists, and clinical psychologists.
