# THE JUNGIAN ODYSSEY 2011

is approaching its 6th year of success as an off-campus, English-language retreat. At this event ISAPZURICH opens its post-graduate program to all with interest in CG Jung & Analytical Psychology. Taking place each year in a different region of Switzerland, the Odyssey affords immersion in landscapes

that influenced Jung's sense of psyche, and that infuse each retreat with a particular *genius loci*. Presenters deal with traditional Jungian areas of interest—myth, fairy tale, art, religion, dream—connecting these with contemporary research, clinical practice, personal and collective experience.



## THE PLAYFUL PSYCHE

This year's Odyssey invites your journey to Ticino in the southern Swiss Alps, and the mystical Monte Verità—the “Mountain of Truth,” rising above the harbor village of Ascona and the jagged-banked Lake Maggiore. Monte Verità has been compared with Stonehenge in being widely celebrated as a *Kraftort*—an erstwhile sacred ground, where the earth itself resonates with powers of strength, healing, and archetypal wisdom. The modern history began in 1899 when a group of European anarchists cast off bourgeois society, capitalism, and an industrializing civilization. They vowed to re-discover humanity's “harmony with nature,” to be found in “the unity of body, soul, intellect,” and in “psychical and intellectual potentiality, unknown or repressed.” To these ends, in 1900 they formed the Monte Verità colony, where they lived as vegetarians, nudists, and devotees of open-air exercise, bathing, cathartic ritual dance—and as explorers of new spiritual directions emerging through psychoanalysis, philosophy, and study of the arts, myth and symbol. Growing from vibrant colony, to public sanatorium, to renowned cultural center, Monte Verità has drawn many ground-breaking artists and thinkers, including among others Otto Gross, Rudolf Laban, Mary Wigman, Isadora Duncan, Hermann Hesse, Jean Arp, Paul Klee, Rudolf Steiner—and CG Jung. ## HOTEL, COST, REGISTRATION



The historic 3-star Hotel Monte Verità, standing atop its namesake mountain, boasts three especially panoramic views: the Loreley Cliffs, the Valkyrie Cliffs, and the Harris Jump. The hotel complex consists of a number of *casas* built in the art nouveau style beginning ca. 1904—and today's main building, completed in 1928 and later renovated, preserving the original Bauhaus style. The rooms are accordingly sparing in design and comfortable, with magnificent views of Lake Maggiore

or the surrounding woodlands. The buildings are linked by rustic trails that meander past exotic plants and through the woods, where one can still see the original open-air showers, bath tubs, and wooden “air huts.” Odyssey fees cover ground transport to Ascona and back to Zurich • full room & board (excluding dinners on 2 excursion dates) • all retreat events. Price advantage with registration by March 6, 2011: single CHF 3320.00; double, per person, CHF 3000.00. Travel to and from Switzerland is not included. # EXCURSIONS



**Eranos** It will be our great privilege and delight to attend a talk and enjoy a picnic at the historic and tranquil Eranos on Lake Maggiore, just beneath Monte Verità. In 1928, the Polish heiress, Olga Fröbe-Kapptejn, enhancing her lakeside *casa*, added a “conference room ..., without knowing that this was the beginning of an incredible success story of international gatherings .... The ‘Eranos Tagungen’ and the ‘Eranos Method’ were progressively shaped under the influence of important characters such as Carl Gustav Jung, Rudolf Otto, Mircea Eliade, Karl Kerényi, Erich Neumann ....” Indeed, it was at Eranos that Jung gave his first lecture on synchronicity. Eranos thrived through the second World War until the mid eighties, and today still continues to function as a center for retreats and small conferences.

**Brissago Islands** A short boat ride on Lake Maggiore takes us to the exotic botanical gardens located on the idyllic Islands of Brissago. In 1885 the Russian Baroness Antonietta Saint Leger bought the islands, restored the remains of a convent there, and proceeded to create the gardens. In this paradise of flowers, the baroness hosted many painters, sculptors, musicians, and writers. After passing to other ownership the place fell into decay. In 1949 the islands came under cantonal protection, and were opened in 1950 to the public as a nature preserve and place of historic interest. Among Ticino’s most popular attractions, the once neglected gardens now contain 1700 plants from around the world, including species from Mediterranean climes, China, Korea, Japan, South Africa, Australia and islands of the Indian Ocean.

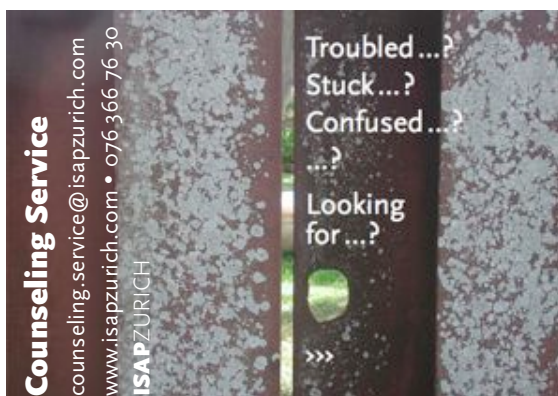

AGAP is a founding member of the International Association of Analytical Psychology (IAAP), with training privileges. In 2004 AGAP established the International School of Analytical Psychology Zurich—ISAPZURICH.



**ISAP** On the home turf of the renowned Swiss psychologist CG Jung, ISAP conducts full-time post-graduate training that leads to a Diploma in Analytical Psychology. As a member of the Swiss Charta for Psychotherapy, ISAP is recognized by the Health Department of Canton Zurich as a psychotherapy training institution. True to the Zurich tradition, ISAP's faculty members, guest instructors and trainees from around the world enrich the program with a variety of professional and cultural backgrounds.
