What's Cooking In New Orleans?

You are invited to attend a **GATHERING** exclusively for Jungian Analysts and Candidates at the historic **Hotel Monteleone**--located in the French Quarter from **Thursday, Nov. 10th to Sunday the 13th, 2011.**

The theme of this GATHERING is meant to invoke a palpable, experiential sense of the diverse ingredients that make up the field of Jungian psychology today. We will focus on identifying new ideas emerging on our Jungian horizon and explore how we are called to wrestle with them. We will endeavor to encourage open discussion and participation.

THE EVENTS IN MORE DETAIL:

Thursday evening 6:00 to 7:30 pm

We will begin with an opening reception and cash bar during which the New Orleans analysts will orient us to the culture and psychology of this fertile, complex and creative city. This will be followed by dinner on your own or in restaurants hosted by local analysts.

Friday 9:00 to 12:30 and 2:30 to 5:00

Following a brief orientation, we move into Friday's project: concrete, hands-on exploration of the attitudes and methods we use currently in our Jungian practices.

Why this project?

We of the Program Committee have imagined a number of distinct theoretical orientations influencing our field. Our list includes the 'Classical', 'Inter-Subjective', 'Archetypal', and 'Developmental' orientations, as well as a variety of other approaches, such as those drawing upon Neuroscience, Somatic/sensory therapies, and Attachment Theory.

In addition, many of us use techniques drawn from the field of psychoanalysis. Other analysts have adopted perspectives and values from the field of ecological studies, or from cultural studies or socio/political fields. We welcome all of these viewpoints. Our purpose is not to criticize or rank perspectives but rather to gather what is going on, in and around Jungian psychology--and consider how we each integrate these perspective in our practices.

To that end, on Friday morning, we will begin with enactments of therapeutic moments and issues. First, four analysts will work, as best they can, in ways that represent some of these perspectives with an actor/client.

Analysts John Beebe will represent the classical perspective, Linda Carter the intersubjective/attachment perspectives, Ron Schenk the archetypal, and Julie Kilpatrick the neurobiologically based somatic/affective work. They have each agreed courageously to sit in the chair of the analyst.

After each of these enactments, we will discuss the theories and techniques with a focus to what may have worked in one way, but perhaps not in another. We imagine these discussions will be lively and create questions as well as distillations of what our work is about. We envision the day as fun, informative, collaborative, and collegial.

Brief Presentations with Discussions. This day is meant to focus specifically upon the multiple of threads, currents, trends (ingredients) within Jungian psychology. All participants are invited to submit a proposal to speak for 10 minutes (it is longer than you think!) on one of these threads. What moves you? What is cooking in you? What is alive in you now? Tell us about it; eco psychology, post-modern psychology, trans-species psychology, quantum theory, emotionally focused couples therapy, spirituality. Each 10 minute talk will be followed by discussion.
