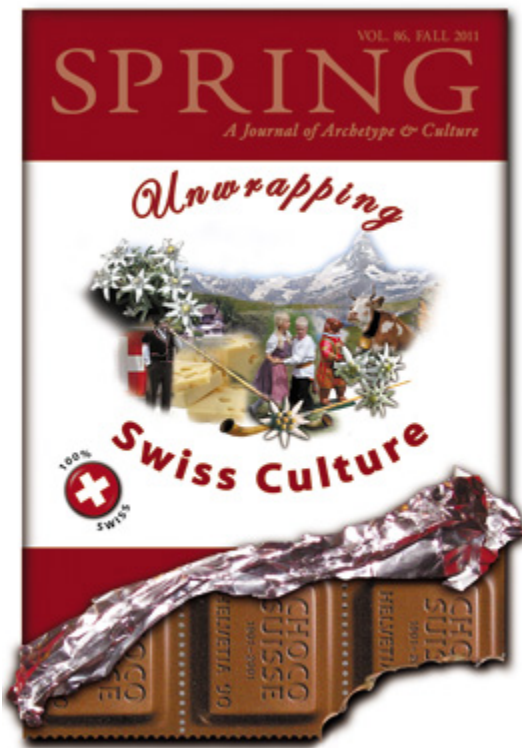




Spring: A Journal of Archetype and Culture
