The Council of North American Societies of Jungian Analysts (CNASJA) is happy to announce the 2009 North American Conference of Jungian Analysts and Candidates, which will be hosted by the Jungian Analysts of Washington Association (JAWA). The conference will be held **October 1-4, 2009** in Washington, D.C.

The theme of this year's conference is:

LOVE AND POWER: USE, MISUSE, AND PARADOX

*Where love reigns, there is no will to power:
and where power predominates, there love is lacking.
The one is the shadow of the other.

The anomalies of love and power exist at the core of human behavior. The dance between love and power is eternal. These energies lie at the bedrock of great literature—Shakespeare, Goethe's "Faust", Nietzsche's "Thus Spake Zarathustra" to name just a few, myths and fairy tales. As individuals who take the journey of developing consciousness, we continuously encounter the uses, misuses, and paradoxes of love and power. And recently, we are observing a transition of the U.S. presidency and a worldwide economic crisis, which shed a bright light on the uses and abuses of power as well as the goodwill and good intentions of those who vie for power and the desire to serve others. Where love and power converge, there are collisions with personal, collective, and cultural history, with belief systems, and with a panoply of psychological as well as physical repercussions.

This conference on Love and Power will explore the dynamics and interactions of these powerful archetypal forces. How do we as analysts observe aspects of this pair of opposites? Are they mutually exclusive? How do we work with various aspects of love and power? Where are they revealed at the collective level? How do they play out? What are constructive ways of working with these energies?

We invite presentations that address the interplay of personal and archetypal aspects of love and power. Topics may focus on any level, from the individual to the collective, from the clinical to the cultural, from the local to the international, from human nature to mother nature.
