# LOVE AND POWER USE, MISUSE, AND PARADOX

The archetypes of love and power exist at the core of human behavior. The dance between them is eternal and the energies lie at the bedrock of all culture. Revealed in literature, music, and art and seen in myths, fairytales, and historical events, these psychic energies are soul-making, inform our lives, and shape great civilizations. As individuals who take the journey of developing consciousness, we continuously encounter the uses, misuses, and paradoxes of love and power. Where love and power converge, there are inevitable collisions with personal, collective, and cultural history, with belief systems, and with a panoply of psychological as well as physical repercussions.

This conference will explore the dynamics and interactions of these powerful archetypal forces. What is Love? What is Power? How do we as analysts observe aspects of this pair of opposites? Are they mutually exclusive? How do we work with various aspects of love and power? Where are they revealed at the collective level? How do they play out? What are constructive ways of working with these energies?

We invite you to join us in exploring the interplay of personal and archetypal aspects of love and power. Topics range from clinical issues to historical examples of our forefathers and their struggles with the mantle of political power, to personal reflections on experience in the contemporary political arena, and to revelations on the world stage and archetypal representations in film and other media of the arts. These presentations will lead us into deeper reflection and insight to highlight—and perhaps move towards—transformation through the effects and influence of Love and Power in our lives. We hope that you will join us in these rich explorations in a major seat of power, Washington, D.C., at one of the loveliest times of year!

The conference is open to all Jungian Analysts, Candidates-in-Training, and all other licensed mental health professionals.

Eros can take us to ecstatic heights, but also to the depths of despair especially when we have conflated Eros and power. As long as the connection between Eros and power stays in the shadow, the more we get lost in compulsive longing, destructive relationships and sexual addictions. In this workshop, we will struggle to understand the nature of Eros and erotic longing in both its sensual and spiritual aspects and will amplify our exploration with archetypal and clinical examples.

### WANTING TO BE SEEN, LONGING TO BE LOVED: ART MAKING IN ANALYSIS SONDRA GELLER [PAJA/PHILADELPHIA]

We will use tissue paper collage to draw us into psyche. The process is playful, creative and healing. Under the unconditionally accepting gaze of the analyst/witness, participants will learn how to make and then look deeply into colorful, expressive collages discovering the images hidden in the random shapes and colors. Working in this way recreates the fundamental dynamics of the mother-infant dyad where fed by the attuned maternal gaze the archetypal longing to be seen is mirrored. These experiences help to create *temenos*, a prerequisite for feeling loved and a catalyst for individuation.
