## Statement for the Candidacy of AIPA in the Executive Committee of IAAP for the term 2019-2021

The “Associazione Italiana di Psicologia Analitica” (AIPA) is the oldest Jungian Society in Italy, founded by Ernst Bernhard in 1961, with the central seat in Rome. Very early, a second Institute of AIPA was founded in Milan, and at present AIPA has also a seat in Firenze and one in Naples.

AIPA has continued, in the last 10 years, to keep good connections with CIPA, the second Jungian Society formed in Italy: in 2020, AIPA and CIPA together will organise an international conference with the title “Psiche’s fragments: complex traumatic processes and Analytical Psychology”, following two years of research by a working-group formed by Italian analysts members of AIPA and CIPA.

More recently, the cooperation is extended also to the third Italian Jungian Society, ARPA: in July 2019, with CIPA and ARPA, we are organising a one-day Conference on “Psyche and Environment”, where prof. Toshio Kawai has been invited to hold the keynote lecture.

The candidacy of AIPA is being presented in agreement with CIPA and ARPA.

AIPA has had the privilege of serving on the Executive Committee of IAAP since the Congress of Montreal (2010) until the Congress of Kyoto (2016), through my own person: it was a very interesting work and it had the consequence of encouraging more AIPA’s members to participate to the international Jungian life. Now, after three years, we would like to be represented once more in the EC through the person of Luisa Zoppi, a senior analyst with training functions in AIPA. Luisa has already familiarity with the work on EC, having participated to the Program Committee of the Vienna Congress, and has been chosen as our representative in the last general meeting of AIPA, on March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

### ASSOCIATION OF JUNGIAN ANALYSTS (AJA) AND THE IAAP EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Association of Jungian Analysts (AJA) became a Group Member of IAAP in 1977 under the leadership of Dr Gerhard Adler who was President of IAAP from 1971 – 1977. Many of the original members had been members of the Society of Analytical Psychology (SAP). These days, there are good relations between all the London IAAP Group members who work together in the ‘Umbrella Group.’

After conversations within our membership, we feel it is now time to take a more active role in IAAP, though many of our members have been participating in Developing Group work in Russia, Ukraine, Poland and elsewhere for many years. We have also had an input to the IAAP Ethics Committee.

AJA, as an organisation, has been working out its own path to becoming more diverse and inclusive. The existing commitment of AJA members to work in and with developing groups is continuing to expand our knowledge of Jungian concepts in diverse contexts. We would want to continue to be active in the area of education and group development as well as in the work of the Diversity Working Group, whose activities we strongly support.

Our new training model is innovative and was accepted by IAAP in 2007. Prior to then, we had a conventional training structure. Now we run the analytic training as a post-post-graduate enterprise. Qualified and registered psychotherapists from all modalities are able to apply and, if they have not had Jungian background prior to commencing the training, are facilitated to obtain the necessary hours of analysis and supervision.

If we are elected to the Executive Committee, our representative will be Ruth Williams. Originally a humanistic and integrative psychotherapist, Ruth is known in London as a conference organiser *par excellence*. She holds a Masters in Jungian and Post Jungian Studies; was trained at AJA where she is now a Training Analyst and Supervisor. Ruth is active in the Black, African and Asian Therapy Network. Her book *Jung: The Basics* was published this year to considerable acclaim. <http://www.ruthwilliams.org.uk/>

## **Expression of Interest for election onto the IAAP Executive Committee**

ANZSJA (established in 1977) is a vibrant and active society that has not up until this time served on the IAAP EC.

We think that ANZSJA can provide a novel contribution to the IAAP EC given that it is geographically large, has grappled well with the problems of cohesion and training that this presents; is a Southern hemisphere society (which would help contribute to balance in the IAAP EC); and, also, it engages with the challenges that emerge as a consequence of white and Asian peoples being colonizers of pre-existing cultures in Australia and New Zealand.

More specifically:

ANZSJA is located in the growing and developing Asian sphere of influence in the world. Analytical psychology and Jungian analysis is living and evolving in countries very distant from its historical and cultural roots. The role of geography in analytical psychology is important from practical, cultural and therapeutic points of view. ANZSJA's presence on the EC would provide a desirable balance in an international society and address perspectives, assumptions and conceptions, which may be different from the traditional geographical regions from whence analytical psychology has arisen and developed.

The latest census reveals more than 15% of the Australian population are ethnically Asian and the younger population is increasingly Asian. ANZSJA has the opportunity to offer a bridge in thinking between Eastern and Western analytical ideas. Australia and New Zealand have different cultural ecologies (distinct embedded local traditions, customs and institutions) yet these different country perspectives can uniquely combine together in one organisation with the opportunity for shared cultural learning of values and practices.

ANZSJA is well placed to try and engage with the different meanings of analytical experience from the theoretical and clinical points of view, within the situational context of paradoxical values and diverse cultural identities within the same organization, individuals and societies. This is of an advantage to the IAAP when considering its expansion internationally and its evolving policy of diversity and nondiscrimination.

ANZSJA has, and is, developing unique experiences at the interface between the digital age and the challenges of vast distances across the Continent, and between Australia and New Zealand. (Geographically ANZSJA covers about a quarter of the Southern hemisphere.) There is both the need to effectively govern and manage the Society, and pursue training and professional development within these scale and complex dimensions.

ANZSJA has deep experience in the use of distance learning technologies and their applications and has something to offer the IAAP in the organizational, advisory and educational areas and to contribute to the development of constructive strategies on diversity.

### **IRSJA Expression of Interest**

The Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts (IRSJA) wishes to run for a seat on the Executive Committee of the IAAP in the election to be held at the IAAP Congress in Vienna.

The IRSJA (founded in 1973) has 220 analyst members. Our analyst members live and practice in 35 States, the District of Columbia and in four countries- Canada, Mexico, Costa Rica and the U.S. We have a diverse group of analysts as members. Half of our members graduated from the IRSJA and the rest graduated from 16 different IAAP Training Programs. 43 Zurich graduates are our second largest group of analysts followed by New York (17), Chicago (15), Los Angeles (12) and North Pacific (7). We have a wide range of theoretical orientations and clinical points of view in our analyst body.

We currently train 37 Candidates in eight Local Training Seminar sites in the U.S. Our Local Training Seminars are located in Boulder, Memphis/Atlanta, Minneapolis, New Orleans, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Santa Fe and Texas. Our Candidates reside in 21 different states. By the time our candidates are in the Control Stage of training they are licensed under the laws of their state or jurisdiction to independently practice psychotherapy.

Our training program is a Federal/State model. The Local Training Seminars are autonomous and set their own curriculum and governance. The IRSJA meets twice a year in Spring and Fall. The Spring Meeting is a working meeting for the Membership Committee, Training Committee, Admissions, Propaedeuticum Exams, Final Case and Thesis Exams and Graduation. At the Fall Meeting candidates meet with their IRSJA Review Committees who follow them throughout their training. At the IRSJA level our Candidates work with a diverse group of analysts from across the Society.

Presentations are given at both IRSJA meetings. Every other Fall Meeting is a special Invitational Meeting when auditors and reading group members are invited to attend a special program of lectures along with our analysts and candidates.

IRSJA is an active member of the Council of North American Societies of Jungian Analysts (CNASJA). Our analyst members have been active in CNASJA leadership.

We believe the IRSJA would make a valuable contribution to the work of the IAAP Executive Committee. We hope the delegates to the IAAP Congress will support the IRSJA for a seat on the IAAP Executive Committee.

## **A statement of Lithuanian Association for Analytical Psychology to be represented in the EC**

The Lithuanian Association for Analytical Psychology (LAAP) became a Group member of IAAP in 2010 and Training society of IAAP in 2013. LAAP is rapidly growing society; there are 21 Jungian analysts at the present moment. All of them have private practise, are involved in process of training, the members are active in giving lectures for public program, and participating in different researches. Development of international relations is considered as an important goal of our association. Organizing seminars of visiting analysts from IAAP, active participation at the IAAP congresses and conferences, organizing conferences in Vilnius (The First European Conference of AP - *“Dialogue at the Threshold between East and West: Cultural Identity Past, Present and Future”* (Vilnius, June 2009) and joint IAAP/Vilnius University/LAAP conference - *“Research in Psychotherapy and Culture: Exploring narratives of Identity”* (Vilnius, May, 2018)) is part of our international activities. We have candidates from Latvia, Belorussia, and Sweden in our training program; our analysts are invited to give seminars in our neighbouring countries.

We are glad that LAAP was elected to be represented in EC in IAAP congress in Kyoto. Prof. Gražina Gudaitė, who did and does a lot for the development of Analytical Psychology in Lithuania and in other Baltic and neighbouring countries, was working as a representative of LAAP in EC (2016-2019). Gražina Gudaitė is a full time professor at Vilnius University; she is an author of several books and many articles on Jungian psychology, also a prominent teacher, analyst and supervisor. In EC she was a part of the Academic Committee and was one of the initiators for organizing the joint IAAP/university conferences. Prof. Gražina was a chief of the research and evaluation working group in Education Committee, which had organized an international research *“Deeper Understanding of the Competences of Jungian Analysts”*.

We would be glad if Prof. Gražina will be re-elected and continues to serve for a second term in EC. Her experience in academic and educational fields, her ability to search for bridges between different spheres (as science and practice) and attitudes (Eastern and Western thought) could be useful for activities of IAAP and for a further development of Analytical Psychology in this region of the world.

I have completed two Jungian trainings: The first one in Israel, which qualified me to become a member of the New Israeli Jungian Association (NIJA) and the second one in London which qualified me to become a member of the Society of Analytical Psychology (SAP)

I have been deeply involved in teaching during the last 18 years in Israel: Since 2001 I have structured and been teaching a course on Psychopathology in Jungian Orientation for analytic trainees and for psychotherapy students in the programmes for Psychotherapy in Jungian Orientation In Israel. Dear President, Dear President Elect,

The SFPA would like to apply for a seat on the IAAP Executive Committee, to be voted at the next Meeting of Delegates in Vienna.

We were elected in Kyoto to hold a seat on the Executive Committee from 2016 to 2019, and the SFPA was represented by Brigit Soubrouillard. With the experience we have gained during this past three years on the Executive Committee we believe that we can continue to contribute positively to IAAP, and thus would like to run for a second mandate.

#### A brief presentation of SFPA

The SFPA is the only group member in France. It is celebrating its fiftieth anniversary this year (founded in April 1969) with a total of 75 members, 12 retired members, and over 30 trainees (both in the first and second part of the training).

The SFPA is an active society which is holding three weekend seminars each year as well as a yearly seminar on child and adolescent analysis, both open to its members and its advanced trainees. The SFPA also offers one day seminars and conferences open to its members, trainees and all professionals interested in Jung.

Most of our members are actively engaged in the life of our society and/or teach at the institute, carry out research, and publish. There are currently two Jungian publications in France: *Les Cahiers Jungiens de Psychanalyse* and *La Revue de Psychologie Analytique*.

The SFPA has been actively engaged on the international scene. Last year the SFPA organized the European Congress in Avignon as well as a pre congress dedicated to academic presentations.

A group of SFPA analysts have dedicated their time to the training of routers in Tunisia, Ukraine and Georgia, and in the past, the SFPA trained and helped found the Spanish society of analytical psychology.

Our project is now to bring together French-speaking analysts from various countries (France, Switzerland, Belgium, Canada, Tunisia...) with the hope to hold French speaking international events on a regular basis. We will start in November 2019 with a conference in Paris.

The current President, Brigit Soubrouillard, who would continue to represent SFPA on the Executive Committee, holds a Ph.D. from the Pacifica Graduate Institute, and trained at the CG Jung Institute Zürich both in the regular program and in the Child and Adolescent program. She has been a member of the SFPA since 1999.

The SFPA also counts a number of members who have been involved in international issues and are able to offer their contributions in different languages, in particular in English, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish.

We hope that the delegates will be sensitive to our contribution to IAAP and to the international Jungian world. We can be contacted to answer any questions they might have and most gladly answer them.
