Speaker's biography

Christopher Perry is a retired Training Analyst and Supervisor of the SAP. He is the author of "Listen to the Voice Within: A Jungian Approach to Pastoral Care", and of several articles on Analytical Psychology and Group Analysis. He worked in the NHS and private practice, and taught on various psychotherapy training programmes. He was a 'Shuttle Analyst' member for eight years of the Russian Revival Project in St Petersburg; and a volunteer expert witness for Refugee and Migrant Justice in the UK.

Andrea Celenza, Ph.D. is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Boston Psychoanalytic Society and Institute and an Assistant Clinical Professor at Harvard Medical School. She is also Adjunct Faculty at the NYU Post-Doctoral Program in Psychoanalysis. Dr. Celenza has consulted with, evaluated, supervised or treated over 350 cases of therapist-patient sexual boundary transgressions. She has authored and presented numerous papers on the evaluation and treatment of therapists who have engaged in sexual misconduct with a focus on training and supervisory issues. Her book, *Sexual Boundary Violations: Therapeutic, Supervisory and Academic Contexts*, was published by Jason Aronson in 2007. She has recently produced an online videorecorded lecture on sexual boundary violations designed for ethics seminars, group viewing or individual use.

Dr. Celenza has been the recipient of several awards, including the Karl A. Menninger Memorial Award, the Felix & Helena Deutsch Prize and the Symonds Prize. Her second book, *Erotic Revelations: Clinical Applications and Perverse Scenarios*, was published by Routledge. Her writings have been translated into Italian, Spanish, Korean and Russian. She just completed a third book, entitled, *Transference, Love, and Being: Essential Essays from the Field*, forthcoming from Routledge. She is in private practice in Lexington, Massachusetts.

Jonathan Coe is the founder and Managing Director of the Clinic for Boundary Studies. He has published on the typologies of boundary violators, and has spoken at a wide range of conferences and events concerning professional misconduct.

Dr John Hook is a Consultant Medical Psychotherapist in private practice and Group Analyst. He led specialist psychotherapy services in the NHS in Southampton and Guildford from 1990 to 2011. He worked for the Clinic for Boundaries Studies developing an assessment model for perpetrators based upon knowledge and experience from the USA. He has published on Sexual Boundary Violations and is currently working with the Department of Psychology, Nottingham Trent University (which specialises in sexual offending) to develop a research project into sexual misconduct by health professionals.
